

# Bean Salad

(Make substitutions as needed) Mix, chill and eat.

1 can Garbanzo beans

1 14 oz Kidney beans

1 can Black beans

1 large can (or more) Green beans

1 can yellow waxed beans

I added 1 cup Edamame

1/2 cup chopped green pepper

(I added red, orange, and yellow peppers)

1/2 cup - or more chopped purple onion

1/2 cup chopped celery

Dressing

3/4 cup Sugar

1/2 cup Oil

1/2 cup Vinegar

1/2 tsp. Salt

1/2 tsp. Pepper

Sondra Perry (Dream Whip® recipe)

3/4 c. butter or margarine

1 ½ c. all-purpose flour

2 Tbsp. white granulated sugar

<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> c. chopped pecans

8 oz. pkg. cream cheese

1.3 oz. pkg. Dream Whip


z. can cherry pie filling

1 c. confectioners' sugar

Preheat oven to 350°. Combine butter/margarine, flour, granulated sugar and pecans. Press mixture into the bottom of a 9x13 baking dish. Bake 20 minutes.

Allow to completely cool before filling.

Prepare Dream Whip according to package directions. Blend the cream cheese and confectioners' sugar. Fold in Dream Whip. Spread over the cooled crust. Top with cherry pie filling. Chill until ready to serve.
