Call to Order:

The meeting of the Alpha Tau Chapter was called to order by President Cathy Stewart @ 5:32 p.m.at the Kaufman County Library Community Room. All in attendance said the Pledge of Allegiance and the Texas Pledge led by Aydee Reyna. **Welcome:**

President Cathy Stewart welcomed those present. This month's hostess committee was thanked for the food and decorations-Let's get Physical theme- which was organized by Hostess Committee: *Karrie Pharris, Bettye Penny, Jo Lynn Maddin, Nancy Shaw, Virginia Fineout, Cathy Stewart, Mollie Kasper and Aydee Reyna. The inspiration was given by Mollie Kasper and reminded us to be present and in the moment. She inspired us to make this year count.

Grant recipient Angie Cutchall introduced herself and discussed with the chapter about her career. She is currently teaching Kindergarten at Long Elementary in Terrell, Texas. This is her first year as a Kinder teacher and she enjoys every minute of it. (Last year, her first year teaching, she taught 3rd grade.) Program:

Our guest speaker was introduced by Karrie Pharris. Flisha Stewart is a certified life coach, author, and owner of a fitness company. She teaches fitness classes in the surrounding areas to women who are over 40.

-Flisha discussed that after 40 females lose muscle mass at 9%. Stretching and other workouts such as Pilates and yoga helps you keep your muscle mass. After 50, the human shoulder muscle starts to break down as well. Therefore, don't do exercises where you must raise weights above the shoulder. Focus on keeping weightlifting to below the shoulder to improve your shoulder muscles.

-When working on standing up from a chair make sure you are sitting on the edge of the chair and your knees are in line with your ankles. Once these are aligned push through your heels to a standing position. If you repeat this exercise, it is like a modified squat.

-Another option of a modified squat is to sit in the chair and march with your feet. You can also stand next to the chair with your hand on the back of the chair for support and bend your knees like you are going to sit in a chair.

-Another exercise you can try is standing in front of a chair facing it. Make sure you stand firm, your knees are in, and your stomach is tight to support your core. Lift your foot one at a time and tap it on the seat of the chair while your other foot is planted on the floor. Repeat with the opposite foot. If this is hard, modify this by tapping your toes below the chair instead of on the seat of the chair.

Thank you Suzy McCook for showing us your exercise skills.
